



ABOUT DHUBRI

Dhubri District – the Gateway of Western Assam, is a land of various racial groups which mingled together and formed a unique cultural heritage. The Dhubri town is 290 k.m. from the state capital Dispur, Guwahati. The district headquarter is located at Dhubri town, which was also the headquarter of erstwhile Goalpara district established in 1876 during the British regime. The present Dhubri town was first constituted as a municipality in 1883. This old town with historical importance is situated on the bank of the river

Brahmaputra and the Gadadhar. Dhubri town is famous for its Netai-Dhubuni Ghat, Sikh Temple, Panchpeer Dargah, Baptist Church and Jain Temple. B. N. COLLEGE AT A GLANCE

ABOUT THE SEMINAR

Immigration is a natural phenomenon; people migrate from one place to another for various reasons. Assam is not an exception of it, it has a long history of migration since ancient time. Over the ages, Assam has received migrants from various parts of the country and even outside. The issue of immigration problem has long been a source of conflict in the state and is a hit button issue of the politics of Assam over the last three decades.

Its impacts are aridly spread in every field of life, social, political, economic and cultural. Illegal migration into Assam from neighboring states, especially from Bangladesh has been posing a serious threat to the identity of the Assamese people and to the security of the nation. It threatens to reduce the Assamese people to a minority in their own state as happened in Tripura and Sikkim.

The issue of migration assumes frenzied proportions, especially with regard to the illegal Bangladeshi immigrants. While the issue warrants a pragmatic and sustainable solution, the mass hysteria whipped up by political forces on it has threatened to tear apart the social life of Assam. In this connection, the role of the state in muddling the issue also invites closer scrutiny whose policy toward the Bangladeshi immigrants can best be termed as divisive. In fact, it will not be an exaggeration to content that state immigration policy has been largely responsible in shaping the agenda of the different political forces on the issues. Unfortunately, the issue has not been solved with sincerity by any government or political parties, over the three decades. Rather most of the political parties have been trying to fish in troubled water using illegal migrants as vote bank. Due to lack of political will and sincerity the issue is yet to be sorted out.

Apart from the lacking of political will of the political parties and governments in the state as well as in the centre, the river erosion being another contributing factor that has kept immigration problem alive. It is hoped that seminar will provide suitable platform to the academics and scholars to debate and discuss the issue of immigration and look for a possible solution to it.
