

A Report on “Three Day Workshop on Sattriya Nritya”

‘Sattriya Nritya’ is a dance-drama performance art with origins in the Krishna-centred Vaishnavism monasteries of Assam and attributed to the saint Mahapurush Srimanta Sankardev. It is originated in the eastern part of Assam. It is generally observed that Sattriya Nritya has of little practice in western part of Assam. Taking on this account, Women Forum, B. N. College, Dhubri in collaboration with Women Cell, BNCTA, B. N. College, Dhubri, organized a Three-Day Workshop on Sattriya Nritya from 8th February, 2020 to 10th February, 2020 in B. N. College, Dhubri.

On 8th February, 2020 the workshop was inaugurated by Dr. Dhruva Chakraborty, Principal, B. N. College, Dhubri.
